# McQ reawakens with pair of wins

Joe Marchese could probably solve a Rubix cube faster than he can figure out his McQuaid Jesuit basketball team.

"I don't think there's a team in Section 5 that we can't beat. But I also don't think there's one we can't lose to," the Knights' head coach remarked with a laugh.

"We've beaten some very good teams, and lost to some teams we shouldn't have lost to. We've played a little to the level of our opponent," Marchese added.

McQuaid was recently mired in a sea of lethargic play which carried over a two-game stretch. The Knights suffered a 53-42 upset loss to Bishop Kearney on Jan. 28, and then scored only 15 points in the first half — including 11 straight possessions without a basket — at Aquinas Institute last Tuesday, Feb. 1.

But the Knights snapped back to life with a fury, outscoring Aquinas 20-4 in the third quarter to erase a one-point halftime deficit en route to a 52-43 win.

McQ continued to roll in its Feb. 4 home game against Wilson Magnet. The Knights won by a 69-52 count, improving their season record to 12-6.

Forward Greg Roehrig and center Ben Wandtke got untracked in the rout over Wilson. Roehrig (12.9 points per game) hit for a season-high 24 points after being held to a combined 19 in his previous two games, and the improvement of Wandtke (12.2 PPG) was even more pronounced as he scored 21 against Wilson after collecting just six points combined against Aquinas and BK.

Roehrig and Wandtke's reawakening was well-timed due to the absence of Rob Norris, who had led McQ with 13 points against Aquinas but missed the Wilson game because of illness.


Aquinas' top scorer in the loss to Mc-Quaid was Shawn Finein, but his 10 points were still well below his season average of 16.8.

Finein then responded with a 23-point effort in a Feb. 4 contest at Edison, while AQ teammate Brad Kelly had a seasonhigh 20 points in that game. However, the Inventors defeated the Irish (5-11) by a 65-53 count.

## Aquinas' strong finish may fall just short of league championship

A case in point is the 1993-94 Aquinas Institute hockey team. AQ has completed its Monroe County Division I schedule with a fabulous 11-2 record, but will likely have no hardware to show for its feat.

The Little Irish won 4-1 over Irondequoit on Feb. 2 and 8-4 over Fairport on Feb. 5 in games played at Lakeshore Rinks. However, Pittsford remained a halfgame ahead of AQ in the Monroe County Division I standings, so the only way the Irish can gain a chunk of their fourth straight league championship would be if the Panthers suffer an upset loss on Feb. 10 to Irondequoit.

"Even in the years we've won the league, I don't think our record's ever been better than 11-2," lamented Coach Dave Montgomery.

Gionta added a two-goal, one-assist effort against Fairport, and Joe Zabawa had one goal and two assists. All eight of Aquinas' goals in that game came in the final 30 minutes after Fairport had held the Irish to a 0-0 tie after one period.

AQ closes out its regular season with two non-league games this weekend: at Rome Free Academy on Feb. 11 and against Greece the following day at Lakeshore.
