**Some taxpayers eligible for Earned Income Credit**

Working taxpayers who earned less than \$23,050 in 1993, and who had children living with them at least half the year, may be eligible for up to \$2,364 in Earned Income Credit on their federal income taxes.

To earn the credit, eligible taxpayers must file either federal income tax return Form 1040A or 1040, and must fill out and attach to the return Schedule EIC.

**Sister Mary Imelda Corrigan; was longtime schoolteacher**

Sister Mary Imelda Corrigan, RSM, a longtime teacher and tutor at several diocesan schools, died on Sunday, Feb. 20, 1994, in Lourdes Hall at the Mercy motherhouse in Brighton. She was 94 years old.

Sister Imelda, a native of Seneca Falls, entered the Sisters of Mercy of Rochester in 1924 and professed her final vows in 1930. She later taught at the following diocesan schools: Holy Cross, Rochester (1924-25); St. Mary's, Corning (1927-33); St. Cecilia's, Elmira (1933-48); St. Charles Borromeo, Greece (1948-52); St. Cecilia, Irondequoit (1952-53); and St. James, Irondequoit (1953-67).

When she left formal classroom teaching in 1967, Sister Imelda served as a tutor and parish visitor at St. James from 1967 to 1981. She moved to the Mercy motherhouse in 1981 and into the Lourdes Hall infirmary in 1987.

"She could converse on whatever was of interest to people, and she was always so pleasant," said Sister Mary Assisium Fitzgerald, RSM, a motherhouse resident who assisted Sister Imelda in recent years.

"Her kindergarten entertainment programs on special days like St. Patrick's Day were just marvelous. She had the
