Colorful coach to highlight Corning gala this Saturday

CORNING — If his outrageous sweaters didn't grab your attention, then his animated outbursts along the sidelines would almost certainly do the trick.

Right up until his retirement after the 1992 season, Lou Carnesecca was someone who constantly stood out in a crowd.

This weekend will be no different — except "Looie's" audience will a crowded banquet room, not a packed gymnasium or national-television audience.

The veteran St. John's University basketball coach will be the guest speaker at the All Saints Academy Gala this coming Saturday, April 9, at the Lodge on the Green in Painted Post.

Just as he was during his 24 years at St. John's, the amiable Carnesecca should be a crowd-pleaser when he visits the Southern Tier.

"He's an upbeat, enthusiastic guy, and that's what we were looking for," said Vincent Moschetti, principal of All Saints Academy, a grade K-8 Catholic elementary school located at 158 State St.

It was Carnesecca's longtime friendship with the Moschetti family that lured the coach to Corning. Vince's father, Al, has known the 69-year-old Carnesecca for nearly a half-century. Both were athletes at St. John's in the 1940s — Moschetti as a member of the school's first National Invitation Tournament champion basketball squad, and Carnesecca as a member of the Redmen's baseball team.

Carnesecca's coaching career began in 1950 at the former St. Ann's Academy (now Archbishop Molloy High School) in New York City. He won three national Catholic high-school basketball titles, and one in baseball, before returning to St. John's in 1957 as an assistant to head basketball Coach Joe Lapchick.

Carnesecca assumed the Redmen's head-coaching duties upon Lapchick's retirement in 1965. His stint at St. John's was interrupted by a three-year run as



head coach of the American Basketball Association's New York Nets beginning in 1970.

In his 24 years guiding St. John's, Carnesecca never failed to take a team to the post-season. The Redmen played in 18 NCAA tournaments and six NITs.

Carnesecca's most successful season was the memorable 1985 campaign, when his Redmen — led by Chris Mullin and Walter Berry — were one of three Big East Conference teams to reach the NCAA Final Four.

His career record at St. John's was 526-200, and 139-79 in the Big East.

Despite these many accomplishments, Vincent Moschetti emphasized that Carnesecca has been a consistently down-to-earth person through the years.

"No matter how high he climbs, he always remembers the guy behind him," the Corning principal said.

Carnesecca has remained active at St. John's through his role as a community-relations assistant for the college president's office.

Looie also stays close to his beloved sport of basketball; in fact, when he spoke to the *Catholic Courier* earlier this week, he had just returned from the NCAA Final Four in Charlotte, N.C.

"I'm busier than ever before," he remarked in a telephone interview.

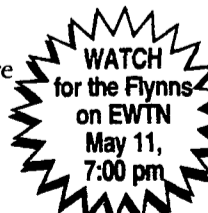
