Nazareth qualifies for national play

PITTSFORD — The Nazareth College lacrosse team begins its quest this weekend for a second national title in three years.

Nazareth will host local rival Rochester Institute of Technology at 1 p.m. on Sunday, May 15, in an NCAA Division III first-round playoff game.

The Golden Flyers closed out their regular season with an 11-1 record by defeating host Ohio Wesleyan, 16-13, on May 7. Nazareth is one of eight teams to qualify for the national tournament.

Nazareth has faced RIT once already this season, scoring a 16-7 home victory over the Tigers back on March 26. Should the Golden Flyers win the rematch as well, they will advance to a semifinal contest on May 22. The national championship game is set for May 29.

Entering the tournament, Coach Scott Nelson's team is ranked fourth in the USILA national rankings. Nelson coached the Golden Flyers to their only national championship in 1992. Nazareth reached the Division III semifinals last season.

Basilio, an Irondequoit resident and parishioner at Church of Christ the King, will be recognized along with several other members of the boxing community.






