Outstanding depth drives McQ golf to 15-1 campaign

With two freshman and two sophomores among its top six players, perhaps McQuaid Jesuit should have regarded the 1994 golf season as a learning ex-

Instead, it's been the Knights who have taught their opponents a few golfing lessons.

McQuaid's young and talented squad recently completed a terrific year, going undefeated in the City-Catholic League and posting a final overall record of 15-1.

It's a scary thought, but the best may be still yet to come: only two of this year's Knights will be lost to graduation.

"This is the best crop we've had from top to bottom in quite a while," Coach Tom Schaeffer commented. "I kept 10 kids, and all of them are players."

A perfect example of this is freshman Kevin Haefner. Normally the Knights' No. 5 golfer, Haefner won this year's City-Catholic tournament title by shooting a 76 on May 19 at Shadow Lake Golf Club in Penfield.

Yet the one Knight whose season has not yet ended is sophomore John Yesawich, who has qualified for state-tournament play. He shot a 79 in the Sec-

tion 5 championship tournament to finish in a four-way tie for second place, one stroke behind medalist Sebastien Hourcaillou of Lyons. The sectionals were held last Monday, May 23, at Wayne Hills Country Club in Lyons.

Yesawich, the Knights' No. 1 golfer, now advances to state play for the second straight year as part of a nine-man Section 5 team. The state tourney will be held June 5-6 at Cornell University.

Other top golfers for McQuaid are junior Randy Teegardin at the No. 2 position; sophomore Ryan MacDonald at No. 3; senior Chip Ranaletta at No. 4; and freshman Matthew Davin at No. 6.

Rounding out the Knights' roster are junior Joe Camp; freshmen Dan Schaeffer and Peter Fleming; and senior Greg Roehrig.

Coach Schaeffer noted that several Knights have taken full advantage of their membership at nearly golfing facilities such as Country Club of Rochester (Yesawich), Oak Hill (Teegardin and Davin), Monroe (MacDonald), Penfield (Ranaletta and Schaeffer), Wild Wood (Haefner) and Midvale (Camp).

"They've been playing this game seriously, even as young as they are, for a number of years," the coach remarked.
