Koskie pointed out that the desire to help other people and the need to keep busy often go hand-in-hand to motivate a relired person to work at the hospital, a point echoed by Patricia Ferree, one of his volunteers at St. James.

"What else can I do?," said Ferree, a widow whose children live out of town. "At least you're doing something to help."

A devoted parishioner at St. Joachim Church in Canisteo, Ferree helps out in St. James' human resources office. A retired secretary who worked at Canisteo Junior/Senior High for 24 years, Ferree spends four-and-a-half hours in the office three-to-four days a week.

"I love the contact with the girls that are already employed there," she said. "I just like to type and work on the computer and all the office work."

Liberatore shared Ferree's enjoyment for activity, and pointed out the deeper motivation that underlies every volunteer's work.

"It gives you peace of mind, it gives you something to do, he said.

"It's done more for me than I've done for them," Liberatore added.


