Angels are God's messengers. They bring his words to the people. Sometimes they are also given the authority to destroy wickedness, such as at Sodom and Gomorrah (Genesis 19), or they can protect Christians from danger (Daniel 6).

Angels made several appearances just before the birth of Jesus. It was an angel who told Joseph that Mary's child had been conceived by the Holy Spirit (Matthew 1), and an angel warned him about Herod and told him to take Jesus and Mary to Egypt. Another angel told Joseph when it was safe to return to Israel.

When the shepherds were standing night watch over their sheep, "a great army of angels appeared in the sky praising God." (Luke 2)

Probably the greatest message ever delivered by an angel was when Mary and Mary Magdalene went to visit the tomb of Jesus on Easter morning. The angel said, "He is not here, he has been raised." (Luke 16)

Saint Dominic lived from 1170 to 1221 in Calarvega, Spain. After studying at the University of Palencia, he went on to become an important religious leader. He founded a society of priests, nuns, and lay people officially called The Order of Preachers, commonly known as the Dominican Order. The difference between the religious and lay members of the order is that the lay members have not taken religious vows. Otherwise they follow the same teachings.

The order was originally divided into three sections: priests, nuns, lay people. In 1968 the

three sections were combined to form The Dominican Family.

Dominic Saint founded the order to fight heresy, teachings that contradicted those of the church. Within fifty years of their first organization, Dominican members were teaching at many of Europe's best schools and university.

Dominic is honored on August 4.




