Barbara MacDonald, director of the archdiocesan Center for Family Ministries and task force member, called the signing a "historic event."

But she reminded the group, "Our challenge today and for the future is converting these guidelines into a living document."

In presenting the guidelines, Father Jude Weisenbeck, director of the archdioceşan Office of Ecumenism, said, "I sincerely believe that the strength of marriage is the best gauge that we have of the strength of the church and the strength of the nation."

McManus noted that Louisville is the largest metropolitan area in the country to have adopted such a policy.
