David becomes Israel's king

he people of Israel were unhappy because they did not have a king to rule over them. The Lord did not want to grant their wish at first. come jealous and try to kill me."

"Tell the people there that you have come to offer a sacrifice, and invite Jesse."

When Samuel arrived in Bethlehem, he was greeted by the elders of the town. Samuel was well known as being the chosen man of God, and his anger was greatly feared.

"Have you come in peace?" the elders asked.

Samuel answered. "Yes. Tonight a sacrifice will be offered here for the Lord. Purify yourselves and offer it with me."

Samuel found Jesse and told him to bring his sons with him to the ceremony.
