## Bishops release appeal

### Bosnians asked to stop blaming

ZAGREB, Croatia (CNS) - Bosnia-Herzegovina's bishops have asked their country's warring factions to forgive their enemies, not blame them for the slaughter of innocent victims.

"The enumeration of 'guilts' ... will never end if there is no forgiveness," they said in a statement commemorating the 50th anniversary of the end of World War II.

The statement, dated May 3, was made public in Zagreb by the Catholic Press Agency of the Zagreb Archdiocese.

The bishops lamented that "for nearly the entire 20th century, our soil has been marked by injustices, conflicts, bloodshed and blame.

They noted that World War I began in Sarajevo in 1914 and that a civil war that began in 1991 is still raging, dividing Muslims, Catholic Croats and Orthodox

In between came World War II and

the harsh repression of communist rule, they said.

The bishops asked for scholarly research into the history of the region to sort out the truth.

"Entire books of accusations, condemnations and slander have been written, not only against the Croatian nation but against the Catholic Church," they said.

"It is the duty not only of secular historians but also of the churches to investigate, collect and evaluate data correctly in order to arrive at the truth about everything that has happened," they added.

The bishops set aside May 13-14 as days of prayer for the perpetrators and victims of the 20th-century conflicts.

Their statement came at a time of deep concern over extended fighting in the former Yugoslavia. The end of an often-violated Bosnian truce expired May 1 with an upsurge in fighting. In Croatia, meanwhile, government troops attacked Serbs occupying Croatian territory. This brought retaliatory mortar attacks on Zagreb.

The Catholic Press Agency reported

that Serbs escaping from Croatia into Bosnia expelled 10 Catholic nuns and two female workers from their convents in Bosanski Aleksandrovac and Topola.

The nuns and workers fled to convents in Croatia, said the press agency.


Franz defeated Richard McMunn of Columbia magazine for Eastern regional representative.


