GENESEO - When it comes to Jesus' command to love one's neighbor, St. Mary's Church not only carries it out but the parish even organizes itself according to Christ's directive.

Located at 4 Avon Road, just off Main Street, this Livingston County parish is in its sixth year of operating Neighborhood Ministries, a network made up of dozens of parishioners who provide a vast array of services to their fellow Catholics. Among those services are:

• Respite for caretakers.

• Preparation and serving of meals. • Transportation to doctor's appointments.

• Rides to church.

• Eucharistic visits to the homebound. Organization of funeral receptions for the deceased's family and friends in the parish center.

According to Father William J. Gordinier, St. Mary's pastor, the parish's geographic region is split up into 11 areas that encompass a total of 600 families from the towns of Geneseo and Groveland. Each region is served by volunteers of Neighborhood Ministries who are coordinated by a core leader, who contacts volunteers whenever they are needed to fulfill a certain task, the pastor said.

Neighborhood Ministries has done much to bring St. Mary's members closer, said Cindy Rider, the parish's director of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults and Baptismal Preparation. She recalled, for example, getting her first phone call to prepare a casserole for a funeral reception to be hosted by a man who had lost a member of his family.

"Just because I didn't know him didn't mean he didn't mean something to me," she said.

Parishioners have grown even closer in recent years with the advent of several new programs such as Neighborhood Ministries, she and other staff members said. And that's a good thing, considering the variety of parishioners to which St. Mary's ministers, Father Gordinier said.

Irish and Italians, Germans and Nicaraguans, Vietnamese and Canadians all call St. Mary's their spiritual home along with about 200 college students from the State University of New York College at Geneseo. Over the past year, the parish has had 54 baptisms, 22 weddings and 19 funerals, according to the pastor who said that his church pews fill up every weekend with everyone from little children to senior citizens. "I think that says there's a certain balance there," Father Gordinier commented.

Because of the Synod, the parish has also engaged in extensive collaboration with other area parishes on a variety of new ventures, including the establishment of a parish stewardship committee which taps the time, talent and treasure of St. Mary's members for the church's benefit.

Staff members pointed out that St. Mary's is not too proud to call up another parish and ask for advice on how to organize a program.

"I think one of the things the Synod has done is that it has broken down some of the parochialism," commented Peggy Szczesniak, liturgy and music coordinator.

Ryder agreed.

'There's no more trade secrets," she said of St. Mary's and other parishes.

St. Mary's diverse population benefited enormously from the establishment maintenance. But even more than the parish center the staff credited the 1993 diocesan Synod and the pre-synodal process for opening up constructive dialogue both within the parish and with other Catholic

churches in the diocese. "People were able to speak out as to what our parish wanted," said Madilene Perl, parish administrator, of the presynodal meetings.

She and the other staff members pointed out that the Synod has borne fruit in many ways.

The parish, for example, has held an eight-week adult Bible study course that
