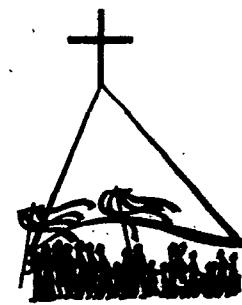


Ten Tips

for Better Family Entertainment.

hear on the radio, and read.



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- 1 Log the time you spend with television, radio, newspaper, bulletin boards, magazines, newspapers, and radio. **IS IT JUST PASSING TIME?**
- 2 Look for Christ in the news, movies, and some TV **SCENES** which values are Christian, and which aren't.
- 3 Call or write your station manager to **APPLAUD** what you like and show your **DISSATISFACTION** with TV programming.
- 4 Trade a TV show for a **trip to the library** once a week.
- 5 Use the news for a **CURRENT EVENTS** discussion at your home.
- 6 Expand your reading choices by subscribing to more than one newspaper or magazine, including your local Catholic paper.
- 7 Set guidelines for which movie and video **RATINGS** your family will allow before going to the theater or video store.
- 8 Consult your Catholic paper for more in-depth **MOVIE REVIEWS** by the U.S. Catholic Conference Office for Film and Broadcasting.
- 9 Choose a room at home for TV and video games, so other rooms are **retreats** for reading, music, and other activities.
- 10 Practice what you preach — if you limit your children's TV viewing, **LIMIT YOUR OWN, too.**
