Illness is forcing Hornell pastor to retire this month

HORNELL Saying that his struggles with Parkinson's disease have made it too difficult to carry out his pastoral duties, Father Elmer J. Schmidt is step-



ping down as pastor of St. Ann's Church.

Father Schmidt's resignation is effective June 27. However, he will continue to reside at St. Ann's Church and remain as active as his health allows.

"I plan to carry on - at a leisurely pace - the privileges of the priesthood," Father Schmidt said.

St. Ann's new pastor will be Father James P. Jaeger, currently parochial vicar at St. Margaret Mary's Church in Irondequoit. Father Jaeger had previously served in the Hornell parish as priest intern and later as parochial vicar from 1987 to 1991.

Father Schmidt, 65, has been pastor at St. Ann's Church since 1983. During his 39 years as a priest, one of his favorite rituals has been visiting the homes of all his parishioners - often traveling by bicycle.

However, the progression of Parkinson's disease - a degenerative disease characterized by rhythmic tremor and muscle rigidity - has severely limited Father Schmidt's mobility in recent years. Currently, Father Schmidt said, he is "50 percent on and 50 percent off."

"There were two times this week I was not able to make it to the sacristy. It's unpredictable, put it that way," Father Schmidt said in a recent interview.

Prior to his assignment at St. Ann's, Father Schmidt was pastor at St. Margaret Mary's Church in Apalachin from 1974 to 1983.

Father Schmidt, a Rochester native,

grew up in Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish. Following his ordination in 1956, the priest also served as parochial vicar at: Rochester's Holy Family (1956-59) and St. Anne's (1959-64) churches; Fairport's Church of the Assumption (1964-67); and Corning's St. Vincent's Church (1967-74).
