

Belfast girls now friends through visit to the U.S.

HENRIETTA - Ask Siobhan Prigent what she likes best about the Rochester area, and she'll answer "Seabreeze," the name of a popular amusement park on Lake Ontario.

The 11-year-old Catholic girl from Belfast, Northern Ireland, has experienced the delights of rollercoasters and other amusements along with her new friend, 12-year-old Sarah Floyd, a Protestant girl and fellow resident of Belfast.

Up until July 27, both girls stayed with Sue and Barry Ackerman, a young Lutheran couple who were among several Rochester-area families to host children from Northern Ireland as part of the Irish Children's Program of Rochester.

The girls traveled with the Ackermans and enjoyed sightseeing in the United States, Sue Ackerman said.

The children participate in a number of fun activities organized by ICP during their stay, which was kicked off with a June 27 reception at Greece's Our Moth er of Sorrows Church (see parish profile page 5).

Children such as Sarah and Siobhan come from a land that has made headlines for decades. For a variety of historical reasons, many members of Northern Ireland's Catholic minority wish to unite with the southern Irish Republic, while many members of the north's Protestant majority want to remain ruled by Great Britain. Tensions between both visions of the region have often led to serious fighting between Catholics and Protestants as well as British and Northern Irish security forces since 1969.

But new hopes for peace arose across the region last year when the Provisional Irish Republican Army declared a ceasefire. The declaration was followed by similar cease-fire announcements from Protestant paramilitaries, and by some talks between members of various par-
