"Love your enemies," Jesus said. "When you say your prayers, pray for those who have hurt you or lied about you. This is the perfect way of my father. Paul studied in a Jesuit school run by missionaries and eventually became a Jesuit priest himself. He developed a reputation for being a gifted speaker and compassionate man.

The emperor appointed some of his officials to try to stop the spread of Christianity. Soldiers crucified Paul and more than twenty other priests and Christians to mock the very religion they died for. We honor Paul on February 6.
