Holy Spirit family promotes conference in Toronto

A nation is only as strong as its families, according to Timothy J. Hansen, a parishioner at Church of the Holy Spirit in Penfield

A first lieutenant in the U.S. Army Reserves, Hansen, 36, said he came to that conclusion while stationed in South Korea in 1987. Unlike many of his colleagues in the service, who saw duty in the Asian country as a burden, Hansen said his year there opened his eyes to the importance of strong ties among blood relatives.

"I feel blessed that I was sent to Korea," Hansen said. "What I gained from the South Koreans was that they were so family-oriented. They have a respect for older people."

Now, with his wife, Eran, Hansen is living out his beliefs by helping to promote the Second Pan-American Conference on Family and Education, to be held May 27-30 at Regal Constellation Hotel in Toronto, Canada. The first such conference was held during the United Nation's International Year of the Family, 1994, in Monterrey, Mexico.

possible; it is not an utopia," the pope wrote, adding that such a civilization is one whose interpersonal relationships resemble those within a healthy family.

The Hansens are big fans of the pontiff and even named one of their three children, John Paul, age 3, after him. It was the the pope's promotion of the "Year of the Family" in 1994 that inspired Eran Hansen to organize a homemaking seminar for working and non-working mothers at her parish that year.


"I really felt it was my little way of contributing to the pope," she said.
