ra's Clemens Center.

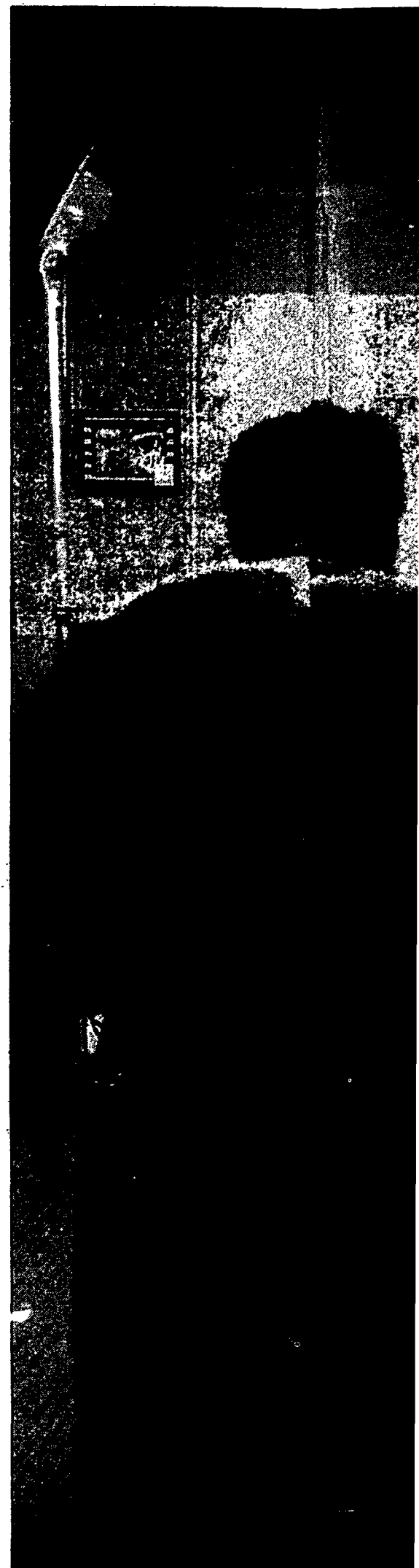

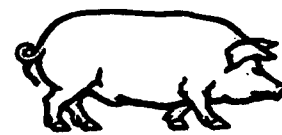
