
I was so terrified, I knelt down and said, "I am a poor sinner. I have seen God, and I deserve to be punished."



Bible Accent

Isaiah, whose name means the salvation of God," is one of the most important prophets of the Old Testament. He was also a nephew of Amaziah, one of the kings of ancient Judah.

Scholars believe Isaiah had three sons, whom he named after prophecies the Lord had given to him: Maher Shalal hash-baz ("quick loot, fast plunder"), Shearjashub ("a remnant shall return") and Immanuel ("God is

with us").
Isaiah's book of prophecies is divided into three sections. The first section is about messages for Judah and Jerusalem; the second is about the visitation of God; and the third is about the restoration of Jerusalem.

St. Laurence

Laurence of Rome was born in Spain in the middle of the third century. He become an ad-

visor to Pope Sixtus II. After the death of the pope Laurence sold many of the church's treasures and gave the money to the poor people of Rome as a protest against the greed and jealousy of some of the church leaders. He then invited one of his supervisors to see the new treasure he had acquired for the church.

When the bishop arrived, he found the church full of poor people. Laurence explained they were the real treasure of the church. The bishop sentenced Laurence to death by fire because of what he had done. We remember him on August 10.
