Tyler, a parishioner at St. Lawrence Church in Greece.

"I was really nervous. There were only around 300 people at my old school, and now I was coming to a big school," remarked Loc, who attended St. Lawrence School last year. (Enrollment is 550 in BK grades nine through 12.)
