When it came time to jump for the bar, Drexel's friends shouted encouragement from below.

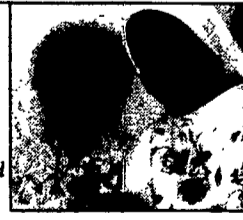
