Bible Accent

The ancient Israelite scribes kept detailed records of their country's history. Archaeologists have also found many personal letters written long ago. The scribes' records and these letters tell us a great deal about the lifestyles and traditions of the Jewish people during both Old and New Testament times,

Mention of official written records occur in the Bible as early as the Book of Joshua. The Bible itself is a translation of some of those written records. Most of the common people were unable to read or write, but the scribes and teachers wrote about events of their time. As a result, we are still able to learn from them today.

St. Albert

St. Albert, also called Albert the Great, was born into a wealthy German family in 1206. A gifted scholar, he studied in Paris and went on to teach in several important German cities.

St. Albert became one of the most influential scientists and thinkers in Europe. He helped St. Thomas Aquinas to apply the rules of logic to religious studies. By the time he was 50, he was a religious advisor to the pope. He wrote and taught for the last 25 years of his life.

St. Albert is the patron saint of scientists. We honor him on Nov. 15.
