


"I am a daughter of the Lord. If this is his wish for my life, I will obey and serve him."



One of the gifts brought to the newborn Jesus by the three wise men was myrrh, a very fragrant gummy perfume that comes from India and Arabia.

Myrrh is made from a woody plant with thorns. In Jesus' day, it was rare and expensive and was used only by very rich people and members of royalty. The perfume was also used as a beauty lotion and was used in ancient times for embalming.
