All of that makes me wonder if they would know one another as well as they do now if they had met in the standard way and had known one another for a similar period of time. I do not know; I just wonder about it.

In any case, things really get exciting at this stage of things. Garon is now in Texas at his home military base. He will go to Louisiana to spend Christmas with his family. And then ... guess what! You've got it. On December 27 Garon will come to Waterford, where he and Kathleen will meet face to face for the first time.

I'm excited about his arrival and can only imagine Kathleen's state of mind. Won't it be wonderful when they can see one another's faces when they laugh? Or when they're just quiet with one another in a way that could never occur in correspondence or on the telephone? Or when they take a walk or have a meal together? And won't it be fun when Garon meets people who love Kathleen and have enjoyed her delightful friendship for years? And how will he react when we tell him what Kathleen is really like?

The experience I have mentioned above and all the questions it raises have been very helpful to me in Advent prayer. They have spoken to me about joyful hope in a fresh way. They have led me to pray and think a lot about how the Feast of Christmas puts a human face on God's love for all of us.

For so much of this I am grateful to Kathleen and Garon. I hope and pray that their moment of meeting next week will be very special for both them, as I am sure it will be for all of us who love Kathleen.

It will be for them the summation of what has gone before. It will also be a new beginning. Who knows what the future holds for them? I only hope that their moment of meeting face to face will be a happy one and that, whatever the future may be, that first meeting will always be a happy memory for each of them.
