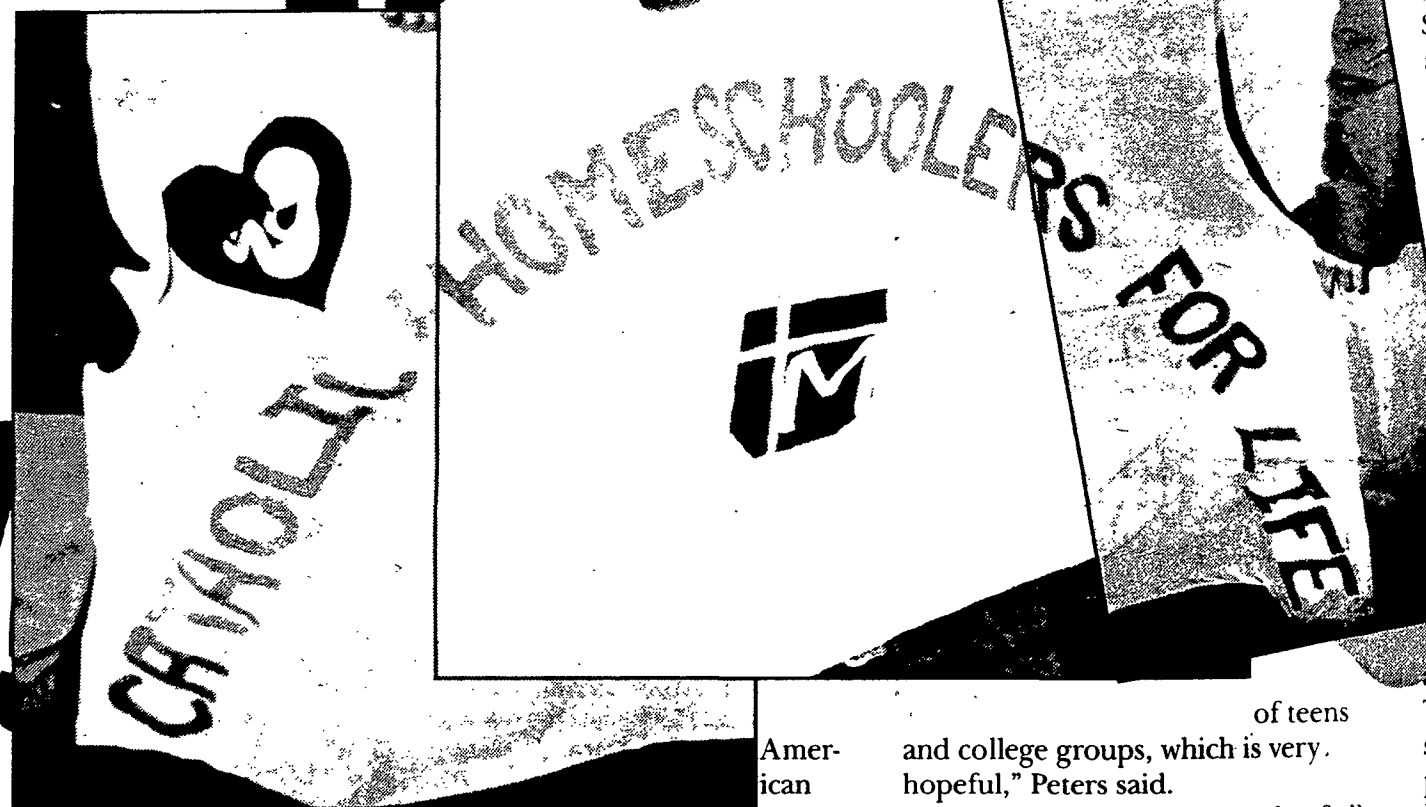
## Taking steps for the sake of LIFE
