Third, Sister Schoelles said she would encourage young adults to consider the ordained ministries, the religious life or service to the church in lay ministry as a way of serving God.

As for her own choice of service, Nam has made plans to travel to the West African nation of Burkina Faso for three years as volunteer in a program sponsored by the Mennonite Central Committee, based in Akron, Pa. In Burkina Faso, Nam will work on water treatment in areas where clean water is a luxury. She doesn't know if she wants to spend her life serving the poor through her work. but she's willing to try it out, she said.

"Right now it's a youthful infatuation," she said. "But I would suspect that if I do enjoy it, it could be a lifelong career."
