

One day St. Roderic tried to break up a fistfight between the two brothers. They stopped fighting with each other, but they beat St. Roderic into near unconsciousness. Then they carried him through the streets saying he wanted to become a Muslim before he died.

St. Roderic was too badly hurt to protest. When he recovered from his injuries and denied his brothers' claims, the Muslim leaders thought he wanted to convert from the Islamic faith to Christianity. So they had him thrown into prison and executed. We honor his martyrdom on March 13.

From Abraham's demonstration of faith in God we can learn to do what God asks. If we try to put God first in our daily lives, God will bless us as God blessed Abraham.


That tells me, as a sixth-grader, to believe in God and always do His will even when it is hard.
