Monday, Aug. 18 - As the plane left the ground, I knew that I was in for an experience that would change my life. With about fifteen minutes left in the flight, I looked out my window and there it was ... France.

Aug. 19 - Tuesday started with a bus tour of Paris, in which we saw many famous landmarks including the Arc de Triomphe and the Louvre Museum. We were able to even stop at both the Eiffel Tower and Notre Dame Cathedral. In the afternoon, we went to the opening Mass at Champs de Mars, which extends from the Eiffel Tower, southeast about to mile. We sat in a spot where we could neither see nor hear what was going on. There were, however, a few radios nearby, which had English translations, so that helped a little.

Aug. 20 — Wednesday morning, there was a catechism in which Archbishop Francis George of Chicago spoke. After that there was a Mass, then lunch, then Paris! Myself, along with three of my co-authors (Brian, Sue and Katie), decided to head for Concord Square, the place where Marie Antoinette was beheaded on Oct. 16,


