So the man lived peacefully in the



The name Eden comes from either a Sumerian word meaning "fertile plain," or a Hebrew word meaning "garden of delight" or "paradise."

The area where the Garden of Eden supposedly existed is usually identified as the fertile land near the head of the Persian Gulf where the Tigris and Euphrates rivers join with two streams to become one river.

But most scholars say that Eden was not a definite place, just as the two stories of creation in the first two chapters of Genesis are not meant to be taken as literally true.


The key lesson in these stories is that the creation of the world and of humans was a result of God's love and goodness.

St. Antony Mary Claret

St. Antony Mary Claret was born in Spain in 1807. After joining the Society of Jesus (the Jesuits), he studied in Rome.

Because, his health prevented him from being a missionary, he returned to Spain. His enthusiasm remained strong and he established the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, commonly referred to as the Claretians, and the Carmelites of Charity. He served for a while as archbishop of Santiago, Cuba, then returned to Spain to become the confessor to Queen Isabella II.

His charitable efforts were responsible for improvements in the banking practices of his day and the building of schools for science, history and music. We honor him on Oct. 24.


