St. Edward also invested money in the restoration of St. Peter's Abbey in Westminster. He was loved by his people because of his generosity and his kind leadership. He believed in treating everyone with respect. We remember him on Oct. 13.


mail. In addition, the winner's essay will be published in an upcoming issue of Kids' Chronicle.
