Bible scholars have divided the Book of Zechariah into two parts.

The first section includes chapters 1-8. In these chapters, he describes visions that he had. Some of the images that appeared to Zechariah were four horsemen who found the earth at peace, a man who measured Jerusalem, Joshua and a flying scroll.

The second section of the book prophesies about a savior who will rescue Jerusalem. Zechariah's description of this savior riding a colt was quoted in the Gospels of Matthew and John when Jesus rode into Jerusalem on what we now call Palm Sunday. Zechariah's message is that God will hear the voice of his people who call on him, and he will be their God.

There are several writings called the Epistle of Barnabas, the Gospel of Barnabas and the Acts of Barnabas, which were initially thought to have been written by St. Barnabas, but have now been at-tributed to other writers. St. Barnabas is the patron saint of Cyprus. We remember him on June 11.
