Bible Accent

Most of the writings of the New Testament were collected between 50 and 100 years after Jesus had ascended into heaven. During the time when the earliest disciples were teaching about the Kingdom of God, no one felt there was a need to write anything down in a permanent record.

Eventually collections of some of the things Jesus had said were written and added to songs and prayers. As the writings were formed into a narrative form, the first Gospel, which is believed to be that of Mark, was completed. Paul added a considerable amount of material to Christian literature with his letters to the different churches.

As the Apostles aged or died, more written records of the life and teachings of Jesus and additional letters by some of the followers of Jesus were produced to create a written text to which everyone could refer.

St. Mary

Mary Magdalene, who most likely received her name for the town of Magdala on the Sea of Galilee, was freed from seven demons by Jesus (Luke 8:2). She became a supporter of Jesus, helping to supply him and his followers with money and material assistance.

Mary was present when Jesus was crucified and she was the first person to see him after he rose from the grave. She is the patron saint of penitents and we honor her on July 22.
