"Welcome to my home, Peter," Cornelius said.

"Thank you for inviting me here," Peter said. "God has shown me that anyone who obeys god, whether they are Jews or Gentiles, are acceptable to • him. God sent his son Jesus to earth, and he performed miracles and acts of goodness. We are witnesses of these things. Even though he was crucified, Jesus rose on the third day, and he chose us to preach with his authority."

The Bible contains many references to food and eating. In the Old Testament, certain guidelines and restrictions were given by God to the Israelites concerning which foods were acceptable to be eaten and which ones were not. Those that were not were called "unclean" foods.


When St. Peter had his vision, God was telling him that if God said something he had cleansed was now fit to eat, then it was permissible for Peter to eat it. God was not only referring to the food, but to Cornelius and all Gentiles, whom many of the first Christians believed could not receive the blessing of salvation from God. Because St. Peter obeyed God, the other early Christians followed his example and began to preach the good news to anyone who wanted to listen.

St. Joseph

St. Joseph was the earthly father of Jesus, and he was also a descendant of King David. He took care of his family after an angel told him that Mary, his wife-to-be, was going to have a son through a miracle performed by the Holy Spirit. The Gospel of Matthew describes St. Joseph as "a righteous man."

After Jesus was born, St. Joseph was again visited by an angel. This time the angel warned St. Joseph that King Herod was jealous of the rumors that a new king of the Jews had been born and Herod planned to kill all children under the age of 2. St. Joseph took Mary and Jesus into Egypt until the angel told him it was safe to return.

No mention is made of St. Joseph in the Bible after he brought his 12-year-old son Jesus to the temple. We honor St. Joseph on March 19.
