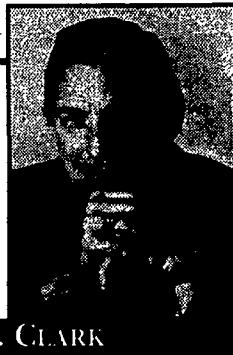
Congratulations to Steve and thanks to his family, friends, teachers, mentors and communities who have guided and supported him during these years of preparation.

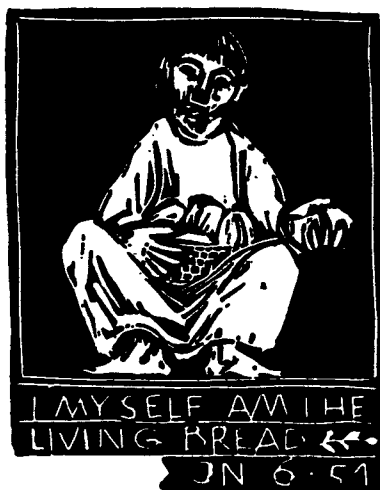
