Four: restitution. "I shall repay it four times over." Luke 19:8.

10: law. Ten Commandments. Exodus 20.

12: fullness, perfection of order. Twelve tribes of Israel; 12 disciples of Christ.

40: a generation, a period of time. Jesus fasted 40 days and nights. Luke 4:2.



St. Aloysius Gonzaga was born in Lombardy, Italy, in 1568, the eldest son of a Spanish marquis. His family hoped he would join the military. However, from the time St. Aloysius was very young, he wanted to pursue religious studies. His parents sent him to Florence, Italy, for his schooling.

In 1581, the family moved to Spain, where he became a page to Don Diego, Prince of Asturias. St. Aloysius wanted to join the Jesuits, but his father and most of his relatives were against the idea. Finally, however, his father relented and at age 17 St. Aloysius joined the Jesuit novitiate.

St. Aloysius often suffered from poor health. Out of concern for his health, he was sent to Rome to complete his studies. Ironically, two years later the plague came to Italy, and St. Aloysius contracted it while helping to take care of patients in a hospital the Jesuits had opened. He survived the plague, but then developed a fever and died at the age of 23.

St. Aloysius is the patron saint of Catholic youth. We honor him on June 21.
