

John urges 'repent,' baptizes hundreds

The man ran toward the gate of the village. "Repent, repent," he cried.


The people who were in the village looked at the strange man.

Bible Accent

Baptism is one of the sacraments of initiation, the other two being first Communion and confirmation, and it has been one of the most important sacraments from the earliest days of the church.

When the Holy Spirit visited the Apostles on the day of Pentecost, Peter invited the people who had been watching the event to "repent and be bap-tized." Whenever new people joined the church, they were immediately encouraged to be baptized. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, baptism frees us from sin and enables us to "confess the faith" of the church.

The church also expects those who have been baptized to support each other in the Christian experience and to increase their own faith through a life of prayer. Baptism symbolizes a life cleansed from sin and a birth into a new life, which is filled with God's grace.

St. Clement 1

St. Clement I was one of the earliest popes in church history, and he lived during the same time as the apostles Peter and Paul. He may even have been baptized by Peter. During a time where he was banished by the emperor to hard manual labor, Clement discovered a spring that could be used for drinking water by the slaves. Prior to that, the only water fit to drink was miles away. He preached wherever he was, and he was so persuasive that 75 churches were built to accommodate the many people who became Christians because of his influence.

One of his important acts as pope was to write a letter to the Church in Corinth to settle a dispute its members were having among themselves. This was the first letter that demonstrated the far-reaching authority of the pope to settle matters in other churches. Legends say that Clement had an anchor tied to his body and he was thrown into the Black Sea, where he drowned. We remember him on Nov. 23.
