Catholic school students take jubilee theme to heart

When the Rochester Diocese recommended last fall that its schools promote Pope John Paul II's Jubilee Year 2000 proclamation, All Saints Academy didn't need to be asked twice.

Sister Karlien Bach, RSM, religion teacher at All Saints, said that the Gates junior high school traditionally adopts a yearly theme. So when the jubilee idea came up, All Saints plugged it right in. "We've really done it the whole year,"

Sister Bach said.

"We made our own posters and hung them," added Megan, 12, of the colorful jubilee art lining the All Saints hallway. Megan is a parishioner at St. Pius X Church in Chili.

And Timothy observed that a banner hanging in St. Theodore's Church – which is attached to All Saints - proclaims the same jubilee message as his own parish.

"'Open Wide the Doors to Christ' is the theme here and at (Rochester's) St. Andrew's," said Timothy, 14.

Each All Saints homeroom has its own banner proclaiming jubilee pledges of forgiveness, thanksgiving, nonviolence, justice, peacemaking and sharing. According to Sister Bach, as part of a Jubilee Year 2000 pep rally on Jan. 3, students in each homeroom took turns blowing bubbles

when their jubilee theme was announced.

Another jubilee event at All Saints was a student-parent day scheduled for Feb. 16. It was to feature a morning prayer service, musical presentation and reception.

In addition, All Saints hopes to collect \$2,000 (as in Year 2000) in pen-





All Saints is one of

many schools following the jubilee theme that Timothy Dwyer, diocesan superintendent of schools, wrote of in a letter to Parents last September:

"During the school year we will begin the celebration of the Year of Jubilee. The year commemorates the roughly 2000 years since the birth of Christ. In the Biblical tradition it is a year of 'Sabbath' and sabbath values: rest, family time, forgiveness (of sin and debt) and returning to the Father."

Indeed, values are a big part of the jubilee doings at St. Rita's School in Webster, where each class has been assigned a jubilee virtue.

"They were assigned according to age level," noted Sister Katherine Ann Rappl, RSM, principal of St. Rita's School. For instance, kindergartners were given the

Maloney also said that Jim Fennessy, a seminarian who is serving at St. Ambrose Church, recently gave a lecture to students explaining the pope's desire to accentuate jubilee themes throughout the year.

Sister Bach, of All Saints Academy, said that she, too, strives to convey the deeper meaning of the Jubilee Year 2000 to students.

"They're going to remember either the Y2K or the Jubilee. It's our responsibility to have them remember the Jubilee," Sister Bach remarked.
