A woman raised her hand toward Jesus. She was afraid, but she approached him. She could not help crying as she said, "Good sir, I touched you.

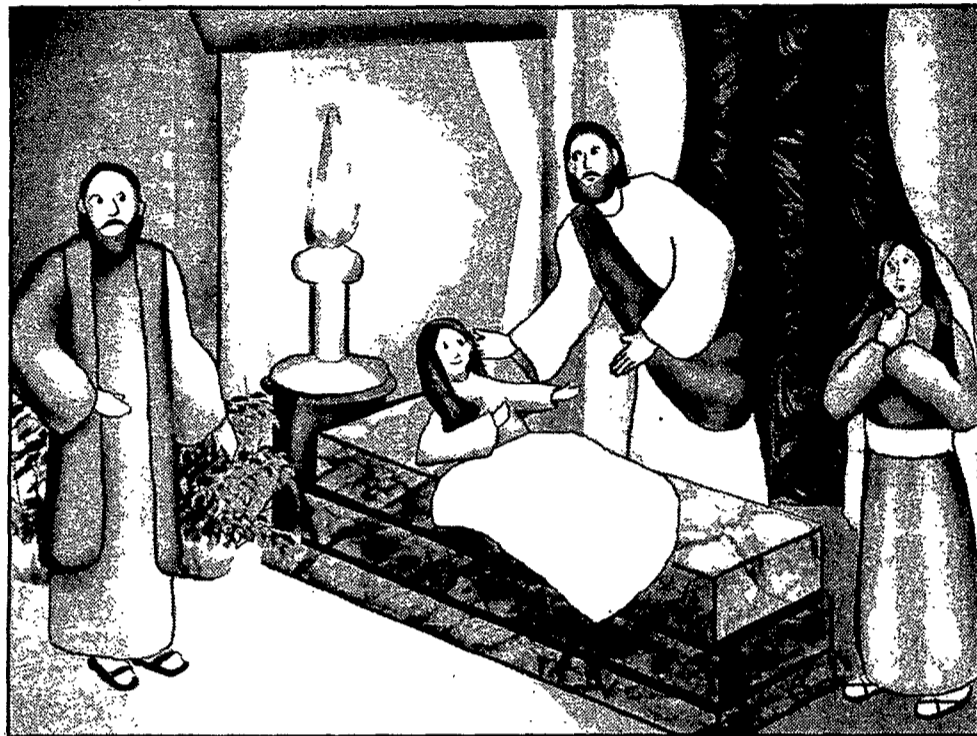

Bible Accent

Jesus was very concerned about the health of his people, and the Gospels tell many stories about how Jesus healed people who were sick or injured. He also encouraged those who were well to care for those who were sick. He healed many people, and he often tried to explain that believing in him was important to being healed by him. Because of his love for us, Jesus took our infirmities and bore our diseases. When the early Christians were filled with the Holy Spirit, God used them to heal people as well. James wrote that if sick people seek out the elders of the church, the prayer of faith will heal the sickness. Today, through the church, we have a sacrament where priests pray for the sick to be healed. This is called the sacrament of anointing of the sick.

St. Juliana Falconieri

Juliana Falconieri was born into one of the wealthiest families in Florence, Italy, in 1270. With their own money they had built a beautiful church because of their devotion to God. Juliana's parents were no longer young when she was born and her father died when she was still a child. Her uncle Alexis helped to raise her and teach her about God. Juliana wanted to pursue a religious life, joined the Servite order when she was a teenager. She worked with several other women who were committed to serving God and their communities. They asked her if she would become their superior. She did not want the position, but she agreed and wrote a code for them to abide by. Because of this code, Juliana is now considered the foundress of the Servite order. She was canonized in 1737, and we honor her on June 19.
