Sr. Marie Patricia Costello, SSJ

Sister Marie Patricia Costello of the Sisters of St. Joseph died at the St. Joseph Convent Infirmary on July 28, 2000. She 50.8×10^{-2}

Sister Marie Patricia entered the Sisters of St. Joseph in 1926 and was a member-of the last group received into the congregation in the motherhouse on Augustine Street, Rochester.

She was a graduate of Nazareth Academy, and earned her baccalaureate at Nazareth College.

Sister Marie Patricia taught in the parochial schools of the Diocese of Rochester for 55 years. Among the schools in which she taught were: Immaculate Conception, St. Joseph's Villa, St. Lucy, St. Pius X and Holy Rosary, all of Rochester; St. Francis de Sales, Genéva; St. Michael, Penn Yan, where she was also principal; Sacred Heart, Auburn; St. Joseph, Wayland; St. Aloysius, Auburn; and St. Patrick, Seneca Falls. Her last assignment was at Holy Rosary, where she served as teacher for 12 years and as supervisor of the lunch program for two years. Due to her failing health, Sister Marie Patricia retired to St. Joseph Convent Infirmary in 1986.

Sister Marie Patricia is survived by her niece, Patricia Mele; other nieces, nephews, grandnieces and grandnephews; and her sisters in the congregation.

Father Bruce Ammering was principal celebrant at her funeral Mass in the motherhouse chapel Aug. 1. He was assisted by Father Robert Bradler. Burial was in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.

Bishop Matthew H. Clark presided at the Aug. 7 funeral Mass for Mrs. Gillette at Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary Church. The Gillettes' close friend, Deacon Al Wilson of St. Paul of the Cross Church in Honeoye Falls, assisted. Bernadine Peets delivered a eulogy to a congregation that included more than 40 deacons and wives of deacons.


