## **Bible Accent**

We call the place where Adam and Eve lived until they disobeyed God the Garden of Eden. The Hebrew word "edin" meant luxurious or pleasant, and the Sumerian (the Sumers were a people of the ancient Arabic world) word "eden" meant a fertile plain or flatland. Using references from the Book of Genesis, some biblical scholars believe Eden may have been in the region near the Persian Gulf. Today this area includes the countries of Iran, Iraq and Kuwait. Four rivers flowed through the garden and there were two trees that God placed in the middle of the garden: the tree of life and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. God told Adam and Eve that they could eat from any tree in the garden except for the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. But Adam and Eve both ate from that tree and God ordered them out of the garden forever. We call this disobedient act by Adam and Eve original sin.

### St. Notburga

Notburga, a young peasant girl, served as a kitchen maid for Count Henry of Rattenburg in what is now the Austrian Alps. After meals, she would give uneaten food from the castle to the poor and hungry people who waited outside for scraps of food. Ottilia, the count's wife, did not approve of Notburga's generosity and forbad her to give any more food away. The countess ordered all uneaten food to be given to the pigs. At first Notburga obeyed, but gradually began to feed the poor people again. The countess found out, and Notburga was fired. After the death of the countess, Notburga was hired back as kitchen maid, and the poor people were once again fed. Notburga lived in the 1300s and is the patron saint of poor peasants and hired servants. We honor St. Notburga on Sept. 14.
