Events in Pittsford, Brighton commemorate Holocaust

An Italian Holocaust commemoration will be presented at 6 p.m. Thursday, April 19, in the Otto A. Shults Center Forum of Nazareth College, Pittsford. Louis Singer of Rochester, who survived the Holocaust, will speak.

At 7 p.m. Thursday, April 26, Dr. Susan Bachrach, curator of special exhibitions at the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum, Washington, D.C., will speak at Monroe Community College, Brighton.

The events commemorate Yom HaShoah, the international day of Holocaust remembrance. Bachrach will speak on "Germany Before the Holocaust and the 1936 Berlin Games." A candle-lighting ceremony will honor local Holocaust survivors and their families. Parking is in Lot F. More information may be obtained by calling 716/292-3338.

MCC is sponsoring Bachrach's lecture, the first in a series by guest speakers associated with The Nazi Olympics Berlin 1936 exhibition. The exhibition will be on campus at the ESL Sports Centre April 29-July 8, on loan from the Holocaust Memorial Museum. The 4,000-square-foot exhibition, tells of the Nazis' rise to power in Germany, the Olympic boycott controversy in the United States and the prelude to the Holocaust that the Berlin Games came to symbolize.

The Nazareth College event is being organized by students as part of a new multidisciplinary course on the Italian Holocaust. Courage Italia, an organization that seeks to recognize Italy's role in rescuing Jews from the Holocaust, and The Center for Holocaust Awareness and Information are assisting in the course and commemoration.
