You have faith in God, Jesus told his disciples. Have faith also in me. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back again and take you to myself so that where I am you also may be.



The Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John have given us a record of the amazing and miraculous events that made up the life of


Jesus They, were written between 65 and 100 years after the birth of Christ. Because the first three Gospels have so many similarities, they are called the synoptic Gospels, which is from a Greek word that means to view together. Some Bibles and religious reference books contain a harmony of the Gospels, which lists where to look to find the different writers, telling the same story. For example, Matthew, Mark, and Luke each record the baptism of Christ, while John did not, yet only

John wrote about the first miracle of Jesus at the wedding in Cana. Each Gospel, reflects, the style of the writer, Luke is a historian, Mark is a storyteller, and Matthew and John could be compared to religious education teachers.

St. Francis di Girolama

St. Francis di Girolama, born in 1642, was the oldest of the 11 children of an Italian family. When he was 12 years old, he lived with some secular priests who shared a house in the community. Francis demonstrated a devotion to God and a gift for understanding and explaining the catechism. Within a few short years the priests had made him a teacher. Francis went to Naples with one of his brothers, where he studied canon and civil law. He became an ordained priest before his 24th birthday, and he taught in the Jesuit college in Naples for the next five years.

When he turned 28, Francis joined the Society of Jesus, the Jesuits. The priests tested him harshly but he excelled in every way so he was sent to work with Father Agnello Bruno in the mission field. Francis was credited with having the gift of healing, but he always said it was due to the intercession of St. Cyrus. We honor Francis on May 11.
