Parish festivals are 'major' events

Watch your local mayor, or maybe your pastor, take a soak in the dunking booth. Listen to the Dady Brothers. Toss a ring and pick out a puppet. Enjoy chicken barbecue.

It sounds like fairly simple summer entertainment. But it takes "hundreds, oh heavens" of volunteers, said one parish festival co-chairman. And earnings can reach \$20,000-\$25,000.

In Newark, St. Michael Parish's Family Festival, and the Newark Fest, will close off about five blocks of Main Street June 8-9.

"It's major," said Lynne Mooney, who chairs the festival committee with her husband, Kevin, and parishioners Sandy and Walt Wolanyk.

"There will be people down at Newark Fest, and we're the only ones on the street doing rides, so that'll bring the kids down."

Profits have helped pay the parish insurance, and also help St. Michael's School.

"You do need to call on your neighbor," said Marilyn Weinert, secretary at St. Christopher's Parish in North Chili, not far from Holy Ghost Church in Gates. "We borrow their fryer, they borrow our tables and chairs."

Lori and Tim Murtaugh are co-chairing St. Christopher's festival June 1-2. Begun by the late Sister Carol Fox, RSM, it includes a 5K race, large basement garage sale and numerous booths under a big tent.

"We are so blessed to have the support of people," Lori said. "You can't do something this size with a handful of people."

The youth will run the dunking booth, she said. But in addition to the youth and a core committee of a dozen parishioners, she said, "hundreds, oh heavens, absolutely hundreds" of parishioners help out. And the pastor is a big supporter.

"Father (Robert) O'Neill says it's great to get the money but it is so important to have the community feel whoever wants to be involved in it in any way, please be involved."

"I think it gives them a sense of ownership, of belonging," she said.

Many parishioners donate items for Grandma's Attic garage sale. "Last year somebody had dropped off a couple paintings. A person in the parish, an antiquer, if you will, Jim Martin, said they looked familiar." So he took them to a dealer who sold them for more than \$1,000, she said.

"We're going to have him again this year, kind of peruse around each night when we begin setting up," she said.

Besides the comradery that flourishes at festivals, organizers said, the family atmosphere is inviting to people.

"It's a very family oriented place," Lori Murtaugh said. It's a safe place and a wholesome place for kids, she added.

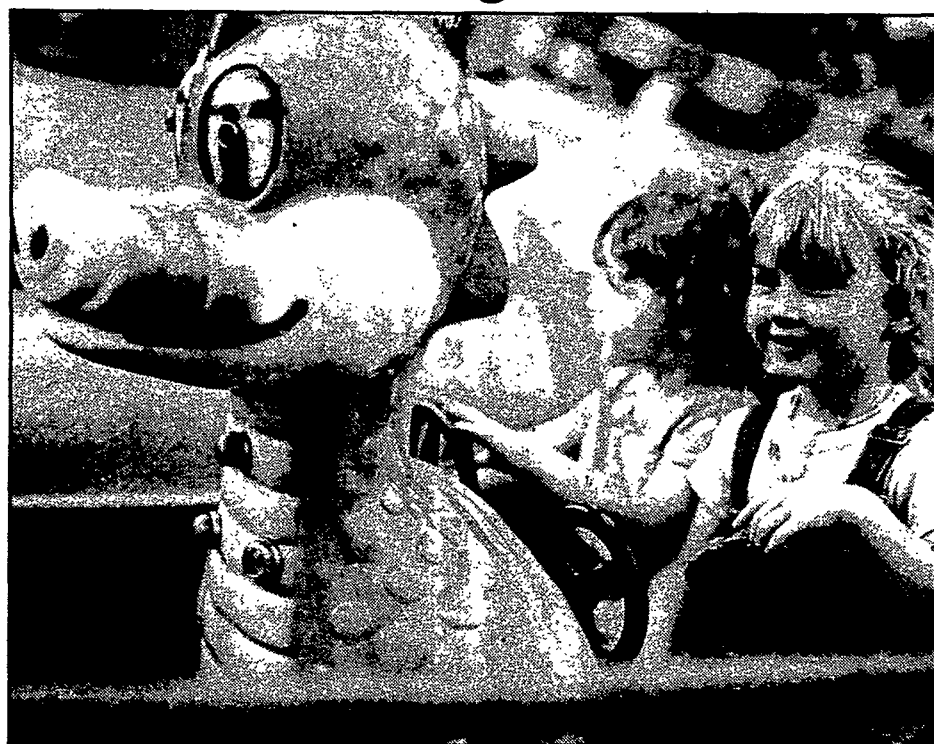
