Father Budnick offers the Eucharist at Watkins Glen International during major race weekends. He regularly has Mass for the Falls Home in Montour Falls and the Schuyler County Longterm Care Facility.

Father Budnick also was director of the Secular Franciscans at St. Patrick's Parish in Owego.



Basilian Father John Poluikis, CSB, 78, the longest-serving priest at St. John Fisher College in Rochester, will celebrate his 50th anniverary with a Mass in Toronto June 28.

He was ordained une 29, 1951, in St.

Michael's Church, Toronto, by Cardinal James Charles McGuigan.

Father Poluikis, who holds a D.A. in mathematics from Idaho State University, first taught mathematics and religion from .1952-55 at Aquinas Institute. In the fall of 1955 he went to Fisher, where he was put in charge of the physics department and later moved into teaching mathematics.

"One of the reasons I was involved in physics at the time, was it was hard to hire physics professors because the government had snatched them all up," he said, noting that the Soviet Union had launched the Sputnik satellite in 1957 and the United States responded with increased attention to science. "The other thing was that 'science was extremely popular at the time at St. John Fisher."

Father Poluikis collaborated with Richard Pegis to first install computer equipment at the college. He continued to work in the physics and math departments until spring 2000, when he retired from full-time teaching. He has continued to teach a course each year in mathematics and computers.

He also continues to get together

every summer with other mathematicians in the Clavius Group, named after the Jesuit who developed the Gregorian calendar, to share work, prayer and recreation. Father Poluikis also has been saying Easter Mass at Hill Haven Nursing Home for three

A Rochester native, Father Poluikis still attends his home parish of St. Stanislaus, where he went to grade school and said his first Mass. He also is a graduate of Aquinas.

Father Peter C. Clifford is pastor of St. Michael's Newark.

He grew up attending Št. Alphonsus Parish, Auburn, and attended the parish school. In 1971, Father Clifford grad-

uated from St. John Fisher College, and in 1975, earned a master's in divinity from St. Bernard's Seminary.

Bishop Joseph L. Hogan ordained Father Clifford at Holy Ghost Church, Gates, March 25, 1976. The new priest then served as priest intern at St. Michael's Church, Penn Yan, 1976-79; and as associate pastor at Immaculate Conception Parish, Ithaca, 1979-81. 
