



in Genoa. He excelled as a student and was allowed to preach while he was only a subdeacon. His gifts for preaching attracted so many people, Anthony was granted a special dispensation to be ordained a priest before he had reached the required age. Over the course of his life, in addition to his regular. priestly duties, Anthony organized two religious congregations, the Missioners of St. Alphonsus Liguori for priests, and one for women dedicated to Santa Maria dell' Orto (of the garden).
