

Steward learns to be prudent

When Jesus was with his disciples, he told them a story. "Once there was a rich man whose property was being squandered by one of his stewards. When the rich man heard about this, he called the steward in front of him. 'What have you been doing?' he asked him. 'Prepare a full accounting of all of your duties. You can no longer be my steward.'

"The steward was very upset that his employer had learned what he had been doing, and that he had been fired. 'What shall I do?' he asked himself. 'I am too weak to dig, and too proud to beg.' He would have no money and no place to stay. So he devised a plan. He would be generous to his employer's debtors, giving up his own commission. Maybe one of them would hire him.

" 'How much do you owe my master?' he asked the first debtor.

" 'One hundred measures of olive oil,'

the man answered. " 'Here is your promissory note. I will

reduce your debt to 50 measures.' "To another the steward asked, 'What

is your debt?'

" 'One hundred kors of wheat.'

" 'Here is your note. I will reduce it to 80 kors,' (each kor being10-12 bushels).

"When the master learned what the steward had done, he commended him for acting prudently."

Then Jesus spoke to his disciples more directly. "The children of this world are more prudent in dealing with



their own generation that are the children of light. The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones; and the person who is dishonest in very small matters is also dishonest in great ones. No servant can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other."

Although Jesus was talking to his disciples, there were other people around who were listening. And some of those people were Pharisees, who loved money. They made angry faces at Jesus. God knows your hearts; for what is of human esteem is an abomination in the sight of God. The Law and the prophets lasted until John; but from then on the kingdom of God is proclaimed."

He went on a pilgrimage to Rome and the Holy Land. Guy traveled to Christian sites for the next seven years. He sought only to strengthen his faith in God and to be able to serve the people of the world. At the end of his journeys, Guy had become exhausted and ill, and eventually died in a hospital in his home country. We honor him on Sept. 12.
