

After learning that he'd made the final cut, Richie spent two days last summer taping the TV commercial at Minerva Deland School in Fairport. The ad depicts "Tommy," played by Richie, and a girl he's just beginning to date. He tells a friend "Dating does not mean having sex" and then informs the new girlfriend — played by McKenzie Miller, 15, of Penfield — that he doesn't plan to pressure her. "Thanks for being so cool about this," she says. "Sure, no problem," he replies as the commercial ends.

Later in the summer, Richie and McKenzie reconvened at a studio for a picture to be used for the upper portion of the poster shown on this page. Then it was off to the Mall at Greece Ridge Center to shoot the bottom part (they're sitting on the steps of the mall's carousel). The commercial and poster were

Richie is a senior class officer at Churchville-Chili. He ran on the Saints' 2001 Section 5 champion boys' crosscountry team.
