
Special events spark memories, renewed hope

Memorial Day weekend is over and we soon move into June. For most of us this time of year is filled with special events. Weddings, graduations, first Communions, confirmations, ordinations and anniversaries dot our calendars. At St. Patrick's the presider's chair is quite close to the first pew. At one of the celebrations, I noticed that the mother, dad and daughter just in front of me were very

attentive to one another and much engaged in the celebration. In fact, I made some reference to that in my homily.

After the celebration I was chatting with them and the mother said, "Do you know that you confirmed me 20 years ago in this very church?" She even mentioned that I had fussed over the tight curls in her hair at the time.

I loved the exchange. I suppose that's because the young mother shared an experience of liturgy that certainly was important in the present moment, but which also drew from it a sense of her own journey of faith and God's fidelity to her through the years. It goes without saying I am sure that the celebration drew the woman not only to a happy memory in her own life, but also to joyful hope for all of her daughter's
