

Divine Mercy day is Aug. 9

Several speakers will be featured at the Divine Mercy Conference scheduled for Saturday, Aug. 9, at Theater on the Ridge, 200 Ridge Road W., Rochester. Registration will begin at 8 a.m., with the program starting at 9 a.m. and a Mass ending the conference at 5:15 p.m.

Included on the speaker and guest list are Basilian Father Donald McCarthy, who serves in the Rochester Diocese and is spiritual advisor for the conference; Father Kazimierz Chwalek, a priest in the Congregation of Marians of the Immaculate Conception and director of the National Shrine of Divine Mercy in Boston; Deacon Bob McDonald, a family counseling expert from Ontario, Canada; Sister M. Caterina Esselen, vocations director for the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy; Lilian Bernas, a stigmatist from Ontario, Canada; John Leary, an author and visionary from Rochester; and Harold McAulliffe, a vocalist and longtime music instructor in the Pittsford Central School District.

Other planned highlights will be a



Chaplet of Divine Mercy; Benediction; confession; eucharistic adoration; and music provided by Simonetta, a nationally known Catholic

singer and songwriter.

The Divine Mercy Conference is similar in nature to the Marian Conference, which had been held annually in Rochester since 1994. Marie Vasile, conference publicist, said the Marian Conference is not being held this year and that several people who have been involved with that conference, including herself, are organizing the one-time-only Divine Mercy program.

"We just had the feeling a lot of people are not aware the Lord is so forgiving. We want people of all faiths; we just want people to come out of the woodwork. We also hope many young people will come," said Vasile, a member of St. Louis Parish in Pittsford.

The Aug. 9 conference will highlight devotion to St. Faustina Kowalksa of Poland, a sister in the Congregation of Our Lady of Mercy who is said to have received messages from Jesus about the Divine Mercy. St. Faustina died in 1938 at the age of 33, and was canonized in 2000 by Pope John Paul II.

Holy Spirit Parish in Webster/Pittsford is serving as sponsor for the Divine Mercy Conference. Cost is \$20 per adult and \$10 per youth. Registrations are requested at least one week in advance, but walk-ups will be accepted as well. For registration details, call 585/671-6534 or 585/671-0813.

Steed earned her bachelor's degree from Old Dominion University and her master's degree from Union University College of Pharmacy in Albany. She and her family are longtime Elmira residents.

Sister Mary Colette Frank, RSM

Sister of Mercy Mary Colette Frank, 99, died at the Sisters of Mercy Motherhouse in Brighton on July 11, 2003.

A native of St. Andrew Parish, Rochester, Sister Frank graduated from Our Lady of Mercy High School in 1920 and joined the congregation in 1927. She received her bachelor's degree from St. Bonaventure University in 1948.

From 1927 to 1943, she taught elementary grades at St. Salome, Mount Carmel and St. Charles Schools in Rochester and Holy Family in Auburn. From 1943 to 1975, Sister Frank, a certified X-ray technician, served in the x-ray department of St. James Mercy Hospital, Hornell.

In 1950, she was a founder of the hospital's School of X-ray and

served as education director for more than 20 years.

For 20 years following her retirement in 1975, Sister Frank's ministry was in pastoral care at St. James Mercy. Since then she served as a spiritual apostolate.

Sister Frank is survived by several nieces and nephews and the Sisters of Mercy. Her nephew, Father Edward Frank, celebrated her funeral Mass at the motherhouse chapel on July 17.
