## Bible Accent

The prayer that we say together at Mass every Sunday is called "The Lord's Prayer" because Jesus gave it to us. It is often referred to as the "Our Father" because those are the first two words of the prayer.

The prayer opens with a statement of belief that God is in heaven and that his name is holy. Next we ask that God's promised kingdom would come down to Earth, and that God's will would be obeyed on Earth as it is in heaven. When we ask God for our "daily bread," a reference to the manna sent to the ancient Israelites in the desert, we are asking him to meet all of our spiritual needs. We ask God to forgive our sins at the same time we promise to forgive people who have hurt us. We tell God we are weak by ourselves, and we ask him to keep us from temptation and to deliver us from any evil.

If we make this our prayer every day, we show God that we want to follow all of his commandments.
