She is a member of Trocaire Community in the motherhouse and ministers in the spiritual apostolate.

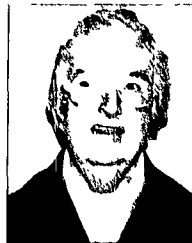


Sister Rita Biel (Sister Mary Neri) entered the order from Rochester's St. Helen's Parish.
